The new FSA Savings Calculator on myuhc.com® adds it up for you!

Our FSA Savings Calculator helps you determine how much you can save in taxes by enrolling in an FSA for the plan year. You can visit myuhc.com and use the calculator whether you're already enrolled in UnitedHealthcare, or just considering your options.

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Type www.myuhc.com into your Web browser.

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If you're not yet registered on myuhc.com, click on "Learn More" in the lower right corner of the site's Home page in the Flexible Spending Account box. This page also allows you to view Frequently Asked Questions, download a claim form, view eligible/ineligible expenses or use the FSA Savings Calculator.

If you're already registered on myuhc.com with an FSA plan, enter your username and password, then click "login." The Flexible Spending Account tab will appear in the top toolbar. As you move your cursor over this tab, a drop-down menu will appear with the option to view Frequently Asked Questions, download an FSA claim form, view eligible/ineligible expenses or use the FSA Savings Calculator.

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Click on the **Calculate FSA Savings** link to start using the FSA Savings Calculator.

Step 1

Enter your estimated out-of-pocket costs for the year. These expenses are automatically totaled at the bottom of the page. The "View eligible/ineligible expenses" link is available if you need to see what expenses can be considered. Once you've filled in your costs, click "Continue."

Step 2

Enter your dependent care expenses. These expenses are automatically totaled at the bottom of the page. Again, the "View eligible/ineligible expenses" link is available if you need to see what expenses can be considered. Once you've filled in your costs, click "Continue."
Note: You can only add up to \$5,000 of dependent care expenses due to IRS limits.

Step 3

Fill in your annual gross income, filing status, number of dependents and any pretax contributions. Click on "Calculate Savings."

Step 4

A page will appear and display two columns detailing your expenses with and without an FSA. You can print this page by clicking the printer icon in the upper right corner.
