Below you will find important information regarding the event.

Student Expectations:

- By choosing to be part of the Youth Caucus at Annual Conference, you are committing to staying in the dorms, taking your meals, and attending session with the caucus as a group.
- You will be on time for and participate in all activities during this event.
- You will abide by the rules set by the event leader and adult chaperones
- Youth members will not be allowed to leave the campus without being checked out and checked back in by a responsible adult (an adult indicated on the registration form as someone who is permitted to pick up the student)

Dress Code:

While we do not have a mandatory dress code, we encourage our participants to be comfortable. And dress in layers, as meeting rooms are often cool but walking around campus can be quite warm. Most adult participants dress ranging from business casual to casual.

Things you need to do:

- Complete your Health History form, and AC Retreat Waiver – these forms are all available on the conference website beginning April 20, 2022. Scan and send them to Kelly by May 25, and bring your originals to AC for check in. (ccym.flumc@gmail.com)
- Watch pre-conference videos found on our Conference Website
- Respond to the email from Kelly Minter to arrange your pre-conference zoom call. Parents are encouraged to attend the zoom to get any of their questions answered.
- Plan to arrive at Florida Southern Campus and at Dorm location on Thursday, June 9 between 8 AM-9:30 AM. You will obtain your room key, room assignments, and meal card at that time.
- Pack Clothing for 3 days of conference session. Plenary sessions are often cold, and June outside is hot. Layers are always a good idea, as well as rain gear (it's Florida)
- Pack Clothing for hanging out on grounds after session
- Pack personal clothing items, pajamas, and other personal care items. You will need bedding for a twin bed or a sleeping bag, and towels.

Staying informed:

During the event, there will be a good amount of social media interaction. At orientation you will be advised of the different media options which will help you to stay informed and to share your experience.

Checking out on Saturday:

- At check-in or during meals during the weekend you will be able to sign up for a check out time slot. That is when you will return your key to the Chaperone in the lobby and be considered “checked-out”. Un returned keys are subject to a \$175 fine from the school, which makes check out an important part of our event.
