Lakeland, Florida, Dec. 9, 1930.

Opening. The Florida Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, convened in adjourned session at Lakeland, Florida, Tuesday morning, December 9th, 1930, at nine o'clock, Bishop John M. Moore in the chair. Hymn No. 208 was sung, the Apostles' Creed recited, and W. K. Piner led in prayer. Prof. Kimbrough, of Southern College rendered a solo, which was greatly enjoyed. The Bishop read a Scripture lesson from Matthew 25:14-30, and used it as a basis of his remarks to the Conference. "Amazing Grace" was sung by the congregation.

Monday Evening Service. Dr. W. F. Quillian, secretary of the General Board of Christian Education, addressed the Conference on the subject of Christian Education, after which the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was administered by J. P. Hilburn, J. F. Bell, et. al.

Organization. The Secretary of the last Conference called the roll and marked the same (See Roll). 223 clerical members and 32 lay members answered to their names. Mrs. I. C. Jenkins was seated as a lay delegate from the Bartow District, in place of L. J. Carlton, and A. K. Hawkins was seated in place of L. F. Vaught of the Tampa District.

Welcome. I. C. Jenkins, Conference Pastor host, introduced the Hon. J. Hardin Peterson, City Attorney of Lakeland, who welcomed the Conference on behalf of the city officials.

Mr. Hervey W. Laird, Secretary of the Lakeland Chamber of Commerce, brought words of greeting to the Conference on behalf of the business men and women of the city.

The Bishop responded appropriately.

Announcements were made by the Secretary.

A meeting of the Orphanage Board was called by the President.

Introductions. The following were introduced to the Conference: Dr. J. W. Perry, Home Mission Secretary; Dr. Domer, a retired Minister of the M. E. Church; Rev. Robt. White, of the Missouri Conference; Rev. C. H. Lindsey, of the United Church of Canada; Dr. W. F. Quillian, Secretary of the General Board of Christian Education, and Rev. Bertels of the California Conference of the M. E. Church.

Dr. J. W. Perry spoke briefly to the Conference.

Reports. S. W. Walker reported for the Tampa District, giving the statistics from each charge. Smith Hardin reported in like manner the work of the Miami District. Watt Smith reported for the Bartow District.

Motion was made by L. M. Broyles that the Bishop appoint a committee of three to arrange for the next session of the Conference. The motion carried, and L. M. Broyles, O. E. Rice and W. A. Myres were named on the committee.

P. W. Ellis reported for the charges of the DeLand District. On motion of P. W. Ellis the name of W. O. Troutman was referred to the Committee on Conference Relations for the superannuate relation.

On motion of B. F. Rogers, the name of J. B. Rooney was referred to the Committee on Conference Relations for the superannuate relation.

On motion of J. H. Daniel, the name of W. J. Nease was referred to the Committee on Conference Relations for the superannuate relation.

G. W. Rosenberry called the Committee on Conference Relations to meet at 1:15.

Announcements of various Board and Committee meetings were made.

L. M. Broyles moved that when we adjourn we adjourn to meet at two o'clock. The motion prevailed.

Resolution: The following resolution was read by P. W. Ellis:

Whereas, there is a Conference-wide conviction that our assessments for Conference Work are oppressively excessive.

Therefore, be it resolved that the Florida Conference reduce these assessments 10 per cent, and advise the various Boards to adjust their assessments accordingly.

P. W. Ellis moved the adoption of the resolution. The motion was seconded.

Motion was made by W. A. Cooper, duly seconded, to lay the Resolution on the table. The motion was lost, and the Resolution was left pending.

O. E. Rice requested pastors to see that Statistical Reports are placed in his hands at their earliest convenience.

J. Edgar Wilson made an announcement in regard to the ADVOCATE.

The benediction was pronounced by W. J. Carpenter.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The Conference was called to order at 2:30 P. M., with Bishop Moore in the chair. After the singing of Hymn No. 355, H. C. Hardin led in prayer.

The minutes of the morning session were read by the Secretary, and approved as read.

Under Question No. 6, Who are admitted into full connection? the name of E. B. Clapp (local deacon) was called, and having passed the required examination, and having been duly recommended by the Committee on Admissions, he was received into full connection by unanimous vote of the Conference.

The Committee on Conference Relations recommended that the names of W. O. Troutman, W. J. Nease and J. B.

Rooney be placed on the Superannuate Roll. The Conference so ordered.

Bishop Moore stated that without objection, R. E. L. Folsom, at his own request, would be released from his work at Spring Lake.

S. H. C. Burgin reported the work of the charges in the Jacksonville District. R. A. Guy made report for the Gainesville District, B. F. Rogers for the Ocala District, J. H. Daniel for the Orlando District, and F. E. Steinmeyer for the Tallahassee District.

The Bishop expressed appreciation of the fine work done throughout the Conference during the past six months by Presiding Elders, pastors and laymen.

W. H. Combs, Miami District, was seated as a lay delegate in place of George S. Fletcher, and Mrs. W. A. Fischer in place of W. T. Henry, Tallahassee District.

A. H. Moore, an Elder, was reported transferred to the North Alabama Conference.

The Judicial Council. The Secretary read the proposed Judicial Council as handed down from the General Conference. L. M. Broyles moved its adoption, and the motion was duly seconded. After discussion by L. M. Broyles, I. S. Patterson, and E. O. Heath, the previous question was called for, and prevailing, a rising vote was taken by the Conference, which resulted as follows: Affirmative, 171; Negative, 26, total 197.

The Bishop spoke briefly in regard to the proposed Judicial Council, explaining certain features of it.

W. K. Piner moved that when we adjourn we reassemble at seven o'clock. The motion was seconded and carried.

Announcements were made regarding entertainment and the meeting of various Boards.

I. S. Patterson read the report of the Board of Missions, which was adopted as follows:

The Conference adjourned with benediction by J. P. Hilburn.

EVENING SESSION

The Conference convened at 7:00 P. M., with Bishop Moore presiding. Hymn No. 393 was sung, and prayer led by J. D. Lewis.

The resolution regarding decrease in assessment, left pending at the morning session was placed before the Conference. P. W. Ellis, I. S. Patterson, Smith Hardin, C. W. White, Thos. Williams spoke to the resolution. Resolution was adopted.

A. M. Hughlett read the report of the Commission on Budget, which was adopted.

R. F. Hodnett made oral report of the Orphanage Board and moved that the Conference grant the fifth Sunday offerings to the Orphanage as heretofore. Seconded. After much discussion the previous question was called for, and prevailing, the motion was put and was lost.

E. B. Walthall offered the resignation of the Orphanage Board.

Moved by J. R. Cason that this resignation be lovingly declined. Seconded and carried.

W. A. Cooper read the report of the Board of Finance. W. J. Carpenter read report of Committee on Temperance and Social Service, which was adopted.

Meeting of Commission on Benevolences was called at once in the Sunday School Building. The Commission retired.

L. M. Spivey offered a resolution in regard to the cancellation of unsold bonds issued on the indebtedness of Southern College. The resolution was adopted.

M. H. Norton moved that an offering be taken for the men who were superannuated by the Conference today. Seconded and carried. \$220.00 was contributed.

R. E. L. Folsom requested, on advice of the Presiding Elder and Bishop, that he be granted the superannuate relation. This was recommended by the committee and granted by the Conference.

Reports No. 1, 2, and 3, of the Board of Christian Education were read by J. W. Blake and adopted.

M. H. Norton reported that the Orphanage Board unanimously recommended H. H. Waller as Field Agent for the Orphanage. Report was accepted.

C. K. Vliet moved that Saturday before the second Sunday in March be designated as Work Day, and that the second Sunday in March be designated as Harvest Day for the Orphanage in the Churches. Carried.

K. H. Koestline read report of the Board of Church Extension, which was adopted.

W. A. Cooper announced that I. S. Patterson was elected chairman of the Conference Commission on Benevolences.

W. A. Myres made announcement in reference to the ADVOCATE Board.

Report of the Conference Treasurer was read by H. L. Phifer.

Moved by I. C. Jenkins that Hubert Dodd be substituted on Committee of Second Year in place of E. B. Clapp.

Moved by I. C. Jenkins that the Secretary be authorized to publish such parts of the records of this Conference as are necessary.

H. E. Partridge made announcement in regard to the Brotherhood.

W. K. Piner moved that thanks be extended to everybody who had had part in the entertainment of the Conference.

Minutes read by Assistant Secretary and approved.

I. S. Patterson moved that assessment of \$100.00 be levied against each District for Conference entertainment.

Changes in boundaries read by the Bishop. Changes in appointments read by the Bishop.

J. R. Cason moved that expression of love and appreciation be extended Dr. Burgin, who was being transferred to Atlanta.

Doxology was sung. Benediction by Bishop Moore.

REPORTS TO THE CONFERENCE, LAKELAND, FLA.**DECEMBER 9, 1930****Commission on Budget**

We, your Commission on Budget, having received requests and heard arguments from the Orphanage Board and the Board of Lay Activities, beg leave to submit the following report:

We recommend:

1st. An assessment as a special of \$20,000.00, for the coming twelve months, for the Orphanage with the understanding that any money raised by the field agent from any particular Church or Charge, shall go as a credit on the assessment for that Church or Charge until the same is paid in full.

2nd. An assessment of \$1,000.00 as a special for the coming twelve months for the Board of Lay Activities. This as-

essment is recommended in view of the vigorous and effective work begun by our Conference Lay Leader, which cannot be effectively completed without this additional amount.

The Conference Lay Leader agrees to use a part of this amount in holding in each District an Institute for the instruction of District and Church Lay Leaders in thoroughly organizing their work for effective service.

These amounts are apportioned to the several Districts as follows:

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION—REPORT NO. 1

Item 1. That we request the Conference to authorize the holding of a Pastors' School this conference year. Dr. R. Ira Barnett and Rev. A. H. Cole have been elected by our Board to serve on a joint committee with the Board of Missions and the Woman's Missionary Society. The Board of Missions representatives are: H. F. Tolle, P. M. Boyd; the W. M. S. representatives are: Mrs. W. F. Dunkle, Mrs. S. H. Bowman.

Item 2. Report of Committee on Fifth Sunday:

In accordance with the provisions of our 1930 Discipline, paragraph 461, Division 3:

We your Board of Christian Education plan to provide the Sunday schools of the conference on the first Fifth Sunday of the Conference year with a program covering the work of our Board of Christian Education for and among the children.

On the second fifth Sunday a program setting forth the interests and work of our Southern College, this to be known as Southern College Day.

On the third fifth Sunday, a program setting forth the work of Christian Education among our young people, through the colleges, Sunday schools, and Epworth Leagues.

On the fourth fifth Sunday, a program setting forth the work of our Board of Christian Education for, with, and through the Adult membership of our Church.

We ask that the fifth Sunday offerings taken on these days in the Sunday schools be sent to the Conference Treasurer to be used by our Conference Board of Christian Education in the carrying out of the program of work, with the exception of that part of the fifth Sunday offering that shall be applied as the General Conference directs.

Item 3. That Rev. C. E. Cook fill the place of P. B. Wells on this board.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION—REPORT NO. 2

We received the following resolutions and submit them to the Conference for approval:

Resolution of Committee on Student Work—

Whereas, several Boards of the Florida Conference have provided a pastor for the Methodist Students at the University of Florida, at Gainesville, and a Christian Education Secretary of Student Work in the Woman's College at Tallahassee.

Whereas, the effort to provide for this work through the Florida Methodist Foundation has failed, and,

Whereas, the General Conference has committed to the Board of Christian Education the matter of carrying on religious work in State institutions of learning, and

Whereas, financial conditions imperil the continuance of the work, and

Whereas, it seems imperative that the work already begun should be continued, and that the agencies which are now carrying it on should continue to be related to it,

Therefore, Resolved, first, that the Florida Annual Conference place itself on record that this work will continue and to this end,

Resolved, second, that a Board of Management of Religious Work at the University of Florida, and at the Florida State College for Women be, and the same is hereby created, composed of (1) the Presiding Elder of the Gainesville District, (2) the Presiding Elder of the Tallahassee District, (3) the preacher in charge of the First Methodist Church in Gainesville, (4) the preacher in charge of Trinity Methodist Church in Tallahassee, (5) the Executive Secretary of the Florida Conference Board of Christian Education, (6) the President of the Florida Conference Woman's Missionary Society, (7) The Florida Conference Missionary Secretary, (8)

the Chairman of the Florida Conference Board of Church Extension, (9) the Conference Lay Leader.

Resolved, third, that to this Board be given full power and authority to secure and to maintain property under the rules of our Discipline for the above purposes in Gainesville and in Tallahassee, and to solicit funds for this purpose within the bounds of this Conference, and to secure from the Boards of the Conference such assistance as they can give, or loan. All property at the University of Florida shall be held by and through a Board of Trustees elected by the Quarterly Conference of the First Methodist in Gainesville, Florida. And all property at the Florida State College for Women shall be held by and through a Board of Trustees elected by the Quarterly Conference of the Trinity Methodist Church in Tallahassee. Said Quarterly Conferences shall control same subject to the Board of Management, which, in turn, shall be responsible to the Board of Christian Education.

Resolved, fourth, that the Board of Management are hereby authorized to select workers to carry on the work and to fix the amount of workers' compensation, and amount of operating expense, and arrange for same; to plan and direct the work to be carried on; and to do all things necessary to provide for and carry on the work of Religious Education for the Methodist Students attending the University of Florida, and the Florida State College for Women.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION—REPORT NO. 3

Members of the Annual Conference:

Whereas, we your Board of Christian Education, are informed by the Board of Education which you continued by special action of your body at its session in June to serve as your agent in matters which have always been the concern of that Board in the past, that the apportionment of \$5000 which was voted as your Board of Education apportionment for the Conference year, June, 1930, to December, 1931, was in the plan of that Board to be used in the ratio of 48 to 3, the larger sum to be applied in the payment of the bonded indebtedness of the Conference in behalf of Southern College and the smaller sum to be appropriated as follows: Pastors' School, \$300; support of student pastor at Gainesville, \$900; expenses of delegates to educational conferences, \$300; and printing of conference minutes \$123;

And whereas, through oversight this purpose of that Board was not stated in the report of that Board to the conference as published in the last issue of our Conference minutes;

Therefore, be it resolved that we approve of such a division of said apportionment and authorize the treasurer of the Board of Education to divide the total amounts collected on this apportionment in the ratio named herein and to apply said funds accordingly.

COMMITTEE OF TEMPERANCE AND SOCIAL SERVICE

We make this brief report involving the following items:

1. We reaffirm the action taken by this conference last June, at West Palm Beach.

2. We suggest an intensive campaign to be put on in every church, to secure pledges from all our members, especially the young people, to total abstinence.

3. We unflinchingly pledge ourselves to the maintenance of our prohibition laws, and if changes are made it shall be done by the friends of the movement and not by its enemies.

4. We insist upon the strict enforcement of all laws which are on the statute books of our State. All worthy and respectable citizens should unite in this demand.

5. We see the gloved hand, and divine the ultimate purpose, of the enemy, in the campaign of falsehood, misrepresentation, and vicious propaganda which has been carried on in a

wet press which seems to have been purchased by the shackles of a few rich men who would profit by the repeal of the prohibition amendment.

We ask all friends of temperance to have nothing to do with certain publications which debase our citizenship and would open the old saloon on every prominent corner of our cities.

6. We are in this fight to win. We ask no quarter from the enemy and we shall give none. We shall answer their falsehoods with **proven facts, sound arguments, THE WORD OF GOD**, and an appeal to the people in the interest of women and children. Neither shall we forget the man who pays the taxes which are so greatly increased by this liquor business.

We come to this fray as David came to battle with Goliath: "In the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom thou hast defied."

7. We hereby enter our whole-hearted protest against any form of race track gambling, either with horses or dogs, which seeks the sanction of law. The proposed plan of a sort of Local Option referendum, is only a process of shifting responsibility, upon the part of legislators who favor such a law.

Local Option on these matters will open the way for debasing the electorate of the State with the use of large sums of money which the gamblers seem to possess. It will also entail a large expense upon the tax payers, besides result in dividing the feelings and relations of the people at a time when cooperative progress is greatly needed.

8. We also believe the Congress should take immediate action to curb the rising tide of Communism. Recent acts in Washington, New York City, and in certain sections of our Southland, cry aloud for such a policy as will preserve our Americanism to the sons and daughters of those who have made the country the "land of the free and the home of the brave."

9. At this juncture, when the lines shall be so clearly drawn, we should do all in our power to harmonize our forces, unite the various agencies which oppose the liquor interests, and present a solid front to the enemy.

RESOLUTION REGARDING BOND ISSUE

THIS RESOLUTION adopted by the FLORIDA ANNUAL CONFERENCE of the METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH, SOUTH, at Lakeland, Florida, on the 9th day of December, A. D. 1930.

WHEREAS in the year of 1927 the FLORIDA ANNUAL CONFERENCE of the METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH, SOUTH by a resolution authorized the issuance of fourteen hundred educational six per cent gold bonds, dated July 1, 1927, of the total face value of \$225,000.00 wherein the FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF TAMPA was named as Trustee, and,

WHEREAS the total amount in value issued of said bonds is \$141,300.00 of which amount \$109,100.00 were returned to the FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF TAMPA, leaving outstanding in the hands of the public bonds amounting to \$32,200.00, and,

WHEREAS bonds in the possession of the FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF TAMPA on December 1, 1930, amounted to the sum of \$83,700.00, which had not been issued, and bonds amounting to \$109,100.00, which have been issued, but returned to said Trustee, and,

WHEREAS it is not contemplated that any other of said bonds should be sold, therefore be it resolved:

That the FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF TAMPA, Trustee under such bond issue, be and it is hereby authorized to cancel all unissued bonds and coupons and all returned bonds and coupons now in the possession of said Trustee and also all bonds and coupons which hereafter may come into possession of the said Trustee, and deliver the said cancelled bonds and coupons to Isaac C. Jenkins, Secretary, whose receipt for such cancelled bonds and coupons shall relieve the said FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF TAMPA from all further liability in connection with the said bonds and coupons so cancelled and delivered.
